Purpose of Job: Teaching Sport and PE to pupils in Pre Prep to year 8 and coaching sports teams.

Main Duties and Responsibilities

- Along with the Director of Sport, teaching PE lessons from Nursery up to Year 8.
- Teaching of Sport lessons across the full age range of the school (Nursery to year 8) in a variety of different sports.
- Coach a team in all three main sports Hockey (Girls only at present, but would like boys to learn to play asx well), Football (Mixed) and Cricket (Mixed)
- Have the ability to lead the school's hockey programme (for the right candidate).
- Demonstrate experience of coaching or playing Hockey to a high level.
- Be confident in teaching other sports that the OPS do Tennis/Athletics.
- · Assist in the general administration of the Sports department.
- Set targets for progression designed to secure good progress for all pupils.
- Maintain records of pupils' achievements according to school policy
- Ensure all required documentation is kept up-to-date and accessible.
